1. Call to Order/Roll Call: The regular meeting of the Operations Committee was called to order at 10:01 a.m. on Friday, August 30, 2024.

2. Public Comments: None.

## 3. Approval of Minutes of April 19, 2024, Operations Committee

On motion of Bm. King, seconded by Bm. Filice, and by unanimous vote, the Operations Committee approved the minutes of the April 19, 2024.

## 4. California Highway Patrol Interoperability MOU for Oakland Area

The committee members inquired about fees. Executive Director Swing stated the goal would be to have interoperability for all of Alameda County and ability for the CHP to communicate with deputies would be ideal especially for spontaneous events which is currently not feasible. There is system capacity with Motorola, but if capacity becomes a problem, this would be scaled back. He is not sure there is a fiscal impact at this time.

Bm. King inquired about encryption issues. Executive Director Swing stated CHP portable radios are compliant with EBRCSA encryption.

Bm. Love inquired if the CHP is borrowing portable radios. Executive Director Swing stated this is for the officers only at the Oakland office for spontaneous events that require additional support.

On motion of Bm. King, seconded by Bm. Nichelini, and by unanimous vote, the Operations Committee recommended approval of the MOU to the Board of Directors.

#### 5. Review Executive Director Authority for Interoperability MOUs

Chair Love inquired about whether the MOUs would have fiscal impacts and Executive Director Swing confirmed it would only apply if they are cost-neutral.

Chair Love inquired about whether there would be an advisement to the committee if an MOU was signed. Executive Director Swing confirmed that there would be an advisement as well as information regarding system capacity.

On motion of Bm. Sanchez, seconded by Bm. King, and by unanimous vote, the Operations Committee recommended approval of the Interoperability MOUs be brought to the Board of Directors as well as authorizing the Executive Director to execute the MOUs if they are cost-neutral.

#### 6. Review Proposed Subscriber MOU

Executive Director Swing explained that there are instances where a vendor (ambulance) does not have the same requirements as a member agency would under a typical subscriber MOU and this would provide for a service payments reduction.

He confirmed that the attorney has reviewed the existing subscriber agreement and recommended a separate agreement for private ambulance companies not provided 911/EMS/ALS services. They are considered a nominal user, but still need an agreement to remain in contract with counties they serve.

On motion of Bm. King, seconded by Bm. Filice, and by unanimous vote, the Operations Committee recommended approval of the new Subscriber MOU and fee schedule be brought to the Board of Directors.

#### 7. Purchase of Replacement Batteries for Highland Park

Executive Director Swing explained that this is an administrative item as batteries are failing. He provided additional information that after the committee agenda was published, the Contra Costa County dollar amount requires \$3,000 in additional funds because the initial amount didn't include shipping and tax.

On motion of Bm. King, seconded by Bm. Nichelini, and by unanimous vote, the Operations Committee recommended approval of the purchase be brought to the Board of Directors.

- **SUBJECT:** Purchase of Replacement Batteries

## **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Receive a report from the Executive Director recommending the purchase of replacement batteries for the Kregor Radio site

#### **SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:**

Each radio site has batteries that back-up the radio system in the event of a power failure. The batteries provide redundant power to allow for the generator to start and begin generating power until the PG&E service is restored. During a recent power failure of the Kregor radio site, staff learned the batteries were in need of replacement. The cost to replace the batteries is \$31,690.40 which exceeds the \$25,000 purchasing authority of the Executive Director. Article VIII, Section 8.1 of the By-laws allows for either the Operations or Finance Committee to make recommendations to the Board of Directors for the purchase of items in excess of \$25,000. Since the items purchased are operational in nature, the Executive Directors is seeking the recommendation to purchase replacement batteries from the Operations Committee. It is anticipated the replacement batteries will last 15 years.
